- Upholding and complying with a school's policy in regards to student protection and safeguarding matters.

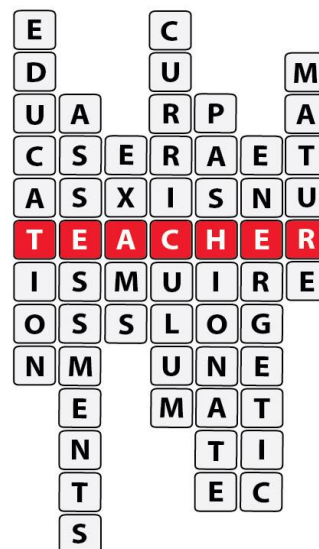
